Mildred Edward's 83rd birthday was celebrated on Easter Sunday at the home of Shirley Riden in Salina.

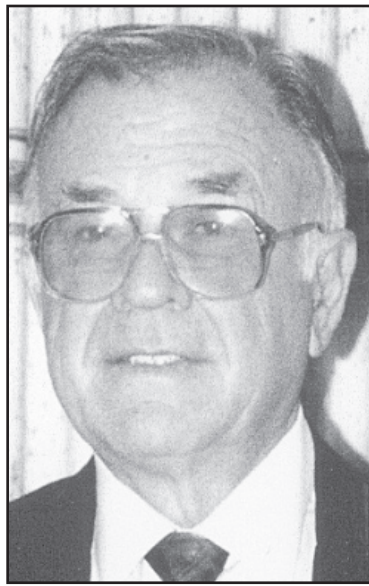
