Public hearing for grant to be held in Bird City

The City of Bird City will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, June 17, 2009, at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall, 111 E 4th, Bird City, Kansas, for the purpose of considering an application to be submitted to the Kansas Department of Commerce for Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Recovery Act funds. A specific project application to be discussed is the rehabilitation of 12 homes for low-to-moderate income families. Rehabilitation may include repairs or replacements of roofs, gutters, electrical, foundations, floors, plumbing, heating, painting, handicapped accessibility and other repairs to meet CDBG Housing Quality Standards (HQS), in a

target area bounded by 4th Street on the north, Bird Ave on the west, and the city limits on the south and east. The project will also include demolition of three unoccupied dilapidated homes within the target area. The estimated total project cost is \$332,740 with the grant request for \$332,740 of the project cost. Other proposals introduced at the hearing will be considered. Oral and written comments will be recorded and become a part of the City of Bird City's CDBG Citizen Participation Plan.

Reasonable accommodations will be made available to persons with disabilities. Requests should be submitted to the office of the Bird City City Clerk, by June 16, 2009.
