In the third inning, Bracelin hit a single for the Indians. Benkleman had a walk, a single hit and a batter took a base for being hit with a pitch and the third run was scored.


The fourth inning, Hill walked and no runs were scored. Benkelman hit two singles and had two walks and scored two runs.
