While she said sewing is OK and she agrees that it is good to know how to do it, her true love is her horse.

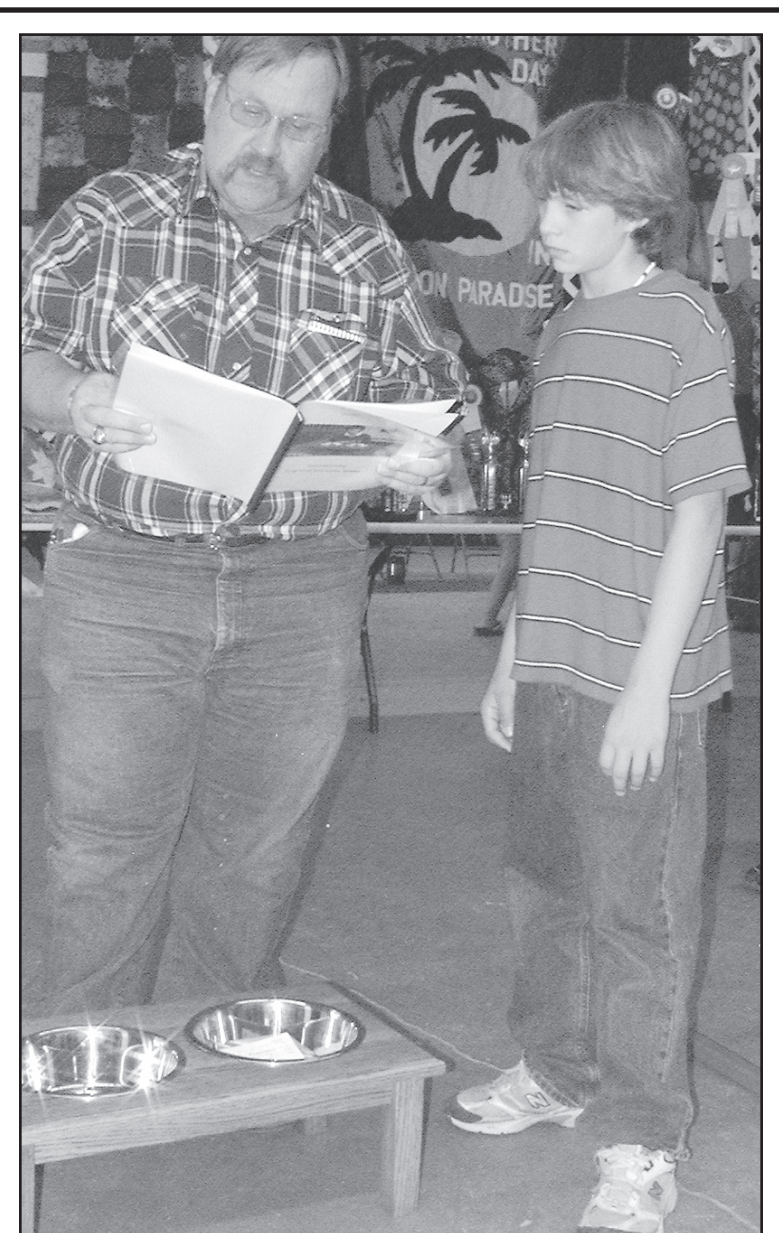
"I like to barrel race," she said.
