Back to school shopping turns into lesson in generosity

School will be back in session and poverty. soon, but many St. Francis kids already have homework—as they learn a lesson in giving.

Through Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project, kids kick-off the school year learning about the impact of giving to children in need. By adding a few extra items to their back-to-school shopping lists and saving the boxes from their newly purchased shoes, kids are joining the effort to help some 8 million hurting children in more than 100 countries worldwide.

Operation Christmas Child, a project of international relief and evangelism organization Samaritan's Purse, headed by Franklin Graham, encourages volunteers to fill simple shoe box gifts with toys, necessity items, school supplies, candy and often hand-written notes of encouragement. The gifts are then hand-delivered to children worldwide who are suffering because of natural disaster, dren in some 130 countries. disease, war, terrorism, famine

"Through this project, anyone can be a part of giving love and hope in a shoe box," said JaNelle Glidewell, Operation Christmas Child drop-off site coordinator. 'St. Francis First Baptist Church is very grateful for the opportunity to serve as a drop-off location for St. Francis and the surrounding communities.

For many of these children, the shoe box gift will be the first gift they have ever received, letting them know they are loved and not forgotten.

Why now-months before the holiday season?

Operation Christmas Child is not limited to just a few weeks a year. It is a year-round project, requiring months of organization and preparation to reach millions of kids around the world. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child has distributed shoe box gifts to more than 69 million hurting chil-
