Christmas gifts needed for project

From Nov. 16 to 23, St. Francis residents hope to gather 250 gift-filled shoe boxes for hurting children overseas.

It looks like Santa has workshops popping up all over St. Francis, said JaNelle Glidewell, one of the coordinators of Operation Christmas Child. Local businesses, churches and homes are prepared to serve as collection points for the Christmas project. Soon, with the help of St. Francis volunteers, the sites will be brimming with festively wrapped shoe boxes full of gifts.

Through Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project, St. Francis residents are packing shoe box gifts for children in more than 100 countries suffering from natural disaster, war, terrorism, disease, famine and poverty.

From St. Francis, the shoe box gifts will be sorted and sent using whatever means necessary—sea containers, trucks, trains, airplanes, boats, camels, even dog sleds—to reach suffering children around the world. The majority of boxes collected in St. Francis will be transported to Mexico, or some other warm climate.

The Christmas project uses tracking technology that allows donors to "follow their box" to the destination country where it will be hand-delivered to a child in need. To register shoe box gifts and find out what

country they are delivered to, use the EZ Give donation form found at www.samaritanspurse.org.

This year, organizers hope to collect 250 gift-filled shoe boxes from families, kids, churches, schools and civic organizations in the area.

Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child, a project of international Christian relief and evangelism organization Samaritan's Purse, headed by Franklin Graham, has delivered more than 68 million gift-filled shoe boxes to needy children in some 130 countries.

Everyone can get involved by enlisting families, churches, scout troops, community groups and businesses to take part in creating shoe-box gifts for the children.

Shoe boxes can be filled with school supplies, toys, necessity items, hard candy and a letter of encouragement. Step-by-step shoe box packing instructions are available at www.samaritanspurse.org.
