The early settlers of Bird City Store, Mrs. Slover's Boarding and the surrounding areas were a mixture of cattlemen, homesteaders, traders, merchants, doctors, lawyers, millers, newspapermen, real estate agents, liverymen, blacksmiths and others, to secure a place in this new land.

They came in covered wagons, by horseback or walked. They built homes of sod because there were no trees except near streams or live springs. As the town grew, the building materials were hauled by wagons from Collinsville (later Benkelman) or Rawlins County.

The Historical Committee for the Bird City 125-year celebration is looking for living descendants of the owners of early businesses or homesteaders from 1880 through 1920.
