They talked about cutting back the base salary of teachers and cutting the salary of other staff verses to cutting staff. Mr. Carmichael said he would rather take a cut in his salary as to cut staff.

Mr. Tice asked if there were ways the school could raise money? The wind turbine at Wray was mentioned but that, it was said, was not working. Mr. Schiltz said the best thing for the school and the town would be to attract young families, thus bringing in more kids to attend school.
