The money is designated for special education. Rob Schiltz Rob Schiltz, superintendent, said he would talk to the special educahe would talk to the special educa- tion teachers about equipment or materials that could be purchased with the money. Building improvements There are still building improve- ments needed in both the junior-se ments needed in both the junior-se- nior high and elementary schools. nior high and elementary schools. Money for improvements and major purchases come from the capital outlay fund which, by law, is not used for the general fund that pays salaries and other expenses. Mr. Schiltz talked about Mr. Schiltz taked about im- provements which would be enerprovements which would be ener- gy saving improvements. Some of these improvements would include replacing the remainder of the windows in the high school, lowering the ceilings and replacing the lights with T5 bulbs in the high school cafeteria and library as well as in the elementary school hallway the elementary school hallway. At some point, the entry doors need to be replaced. 

Mr. Schiltz said the new windows put in the high school last summer have had a huge impact summer have had a huge impact. The west rooms where the new The west rooms where the new windows were installed, have not had the draft that was previously felt on cold days. The St. Francis school buildings, Mr. Schiltz said, are old but are structurally sold structurally sound and worth putting money into. Other improvements which need to be made are refinishing the need to be made are refinishing the high school gym floor, purchashigh school gym floor, purchas- ing security cameras, especially at the front entrances of the schools, and remodeling classrooms. He suggested remodeling one or two classrooms per building each year. No decissrooms per building each yeare made. No Other business n other business: - The Kansas Department of Education requested that all schools in the state sign a memorandum of understanding for participation in the federal Race to the Top grant program. Mr. Schiltz said the de- partment officials believe Kansas partment officials believe Kansas is a prime candidate to receive a portion of the grant money. If Kansas is a recipient of the grant, he said, only the schools which have signed the memorandum will be eligible to receive
