"If you're 65 or older, seek medical advice right away if you develop flu symptoms to find out if you might need treatment with prescription antiviral medications," said Roderick L. Bremby, secretary of the Kansas health department. "People 65 and older are prioritized to get antiviral drugs if they become sick with the

Influenza antiviral medications are prescription drugs (pills, liquid, or inhaled powder) that can treat flu illness. These drugs decrease the ability of flu viruses to reproduce in vomiting.

is the first and most important step in preventing the flu, antiviral drugs are a second line of defense for treating severe cases of flu.

Since Oct. 1, the Kansas Immunization Program has shipped more than 868,000 doses of vaccine to public health departments, health care providers and retail pharmacies across the state.
