Results published for coyote contest

The results are in for the 2010 FoxPro's Midwest Coyote Calling event held the weekend of Jan. 9 and 10. A total of 142 teams signed up and 140 returned on Sunday.

In the two days, the callers reported seeing 1,162 coyotes and brought in 413.

The winner of the Predator Sniper class was the team of Jeremy Gugelmeyer, Dalhart, Texas, and Nick Peterson of Lamar, Colo., with 19 coyotes. They were the first place winners in 2009.

Second place went to Bobby Guzman and Joel Koleman, both of Brush, Colo., with 13 coyotes; taking third were John Griswold, Peidmont, S.D., and Sam Stoddard, Kadoka, S.D., with 12 coyotes. The fourth place team was Stan Cure, Goodland, and Joel
