Indians play undefeated Nebraska team

The Indians met the undefeated Hayes Center basketball team on Friday night on the road and were defeated 75-40. The Cardinals showed their offensive and defensive strengths from the opening whistle and had a 23-9 lead after the first quarter.

"We went to Nebraska Friday to play a really good Hayes Center team," Coach Jeff Beims said. "They have a group of seniors that know how to play the game. They defend well, they rebound well, and they don't make mistakes. It was obvious to anyone watching the game that they understood how to play and are much more instinctive when they play.

"We, on the other hand, are methodical at times, and are a little too mechanical. We defend as a means to keep the other team from scoring, but instead kinda chase our men around until they put up a shot. We run our offense like it's a dance routine instead of looking for opportunities to score out of it."

"As a team we lack the little intangible things that make good athletes good basketball players (and there is a difference)," Coach Beims said. "The only way to make that transition is to keep practicing and play the game. We just have to keep getting a little better every
