Indians outscore Buffs in league competition

The Indians split their games this week with a loss to the Wallace County Wildcats in Sharon Springs on Tuesday and a win over Rawlins County, a Northwest Kansas League opponent, in Atwood on Friday night. The Wildcats defeated the Indians 65-50 and the Indians took Rawlins County by the score of 53-

St. Francis vs **Wallace County**

St. Francis met the Wallace County/Sharon Springs Wildcats on Tuesday. The Wildcats had a 10-6 record going into the game while the Indian were 9-6. The final outcome of the game was a loss for the Indians with the Wildcats posting 65 points to 50 for St. Francis.

"Even though we lost to Sharon Springs I thought we really turned a corner Tuesday night," Coach Jeff Beims said. "We got down big early as Sharon Springs was on fire and we missed several "bunnies" at the rim. We were down by as many as 22 points in the first half, but righted the ship and closed to within 10 at the beginning of the fourth quarter."

M. Raile scored 20 points for St. Francis in this contest which included seven two-point shots, one successful shot outside the arc and 3-of-3 from the line. He also accounted for eight rebounds, five assists, two blocked shots and one

Several other Indians also helped both offensively and defensively. Others hitting three-pointers in this game include Isaac Schiltz, two, and Trent Raile and Dylan Peter, one

St. Francis had only nine freethrow attempts and besides M. Raile's three, Brett Lampe and Peter each had one.

"We took care of the ball against their press real well, although we need to get better at attacking presses," Coach Beims said. "Most satisfying to me though was the way we rebounded. For the first time all year we out rebounded our opponents. We have made that part it kept us in a game that could have recent contest. been a blowout.

Sainty collected 24 rebounds with 17 of them defensive. Schiltz, Garrett Figgins, Trent Raile, Peter and Drew Zweygardt added boards along with M. Raile.

"I have heard on several occasions from opposing coaches this year, that their team played their best game of the year," said Coach Beims. "I'm not sure why we always seem to catch teams on their good nights, but the upside of that is that I'm not sure we have played our best basketball yet. The potential has always been there, and what we saw Tuesday in Sharon Springs may well be a sign that the production is starting catch up with the potential."

"The win against Rawlins County was huge for us for several reasons," Coach Beims said. "First of all it assures us a winning record for the regular season which is nice as it hasn't happened around here very often in the past.

"Second, we wrapped up a home game for the first round of substate with that win as Rawlins County was one of the teams that was chasing us.'

Six players contributed to the scoring with M. Raile having 20 points, Schiltz 11 and T. Raile 10 to lead the team. Matt was 7-of-8 inside the arc and 2-of-4 outside the arc for his 20 points. Schiltz hit his only attempts inside the arc and also had three three-pointers for the evening for his 11 points and Trent's scoring all took place with five twopoint shots, equaling 10 points.

Sainty had only two free-throw attempts and Figgins put both of them through the hoop.

Seventeen assists were recorded with Lampe having seven and the team collected 24 rebounds. T. Raile and Lampe each had six

Of the 10 steals, Lampe and M. Raile led with three each. The Indians had 16 turnovers.

"Finally, and most important to me, is I thought our boys played their best game of the year to date against Rawlins County," Coach Beims said. "Our defense was stifling at times and I thought we committed to rebounding better than we have all year. We were patient on offense, and made shots when they became available. Overall I'm pleased with our effort, and optimistic about our improvements."
