Basketball team ends season with a 12-9 record

Earlier in the week, the Indians had defeated LaCrosse in St. Francis to advance to the second round of the tournament in WaKeeney. Unfortunately, Hill City was victorious in the semi's and on Saturday night the Ringnecks advanced to the state tournament.

Matt Raile, Trent Raile, Drew Zweygardt and Erick Estrada, were the senior members of the squad who dressed for their last outing that night.

"Needless to say, we are going to miss our seniors," Coach Jeff Beims said. "Basketball is such a long season that when it ends I feel like I've lost my family (seeing as how I spend more time with them than my family). Our team will not be the same without Matt, Trent, Drew and Erick. Each of them contributed in their own way.

The Indian basketball squad finished the campaign with a 12-9 record.

The Sagebrush Tournament in Brewster in December was one of the highlights of the year as the Indians defeated Triplains, Cheylin and Brewster to earn the championship.

The Indians are also members of the Northwest Kansas League and competed with each team in the league, Colby, Goodland, Hoxie, Oakley, Oberlin/Decatur Community, Quinter and Rawlins County during the season. They

The Northwest Kansas League will be minus Colby and Goodland next year so it is possible there will be new opponents in the horizon next year.




