Women's Fellowship will be having a spring salad luncheon at noon on Wednesday, April 14. Everyone is welcome to attend at the St. John Church.

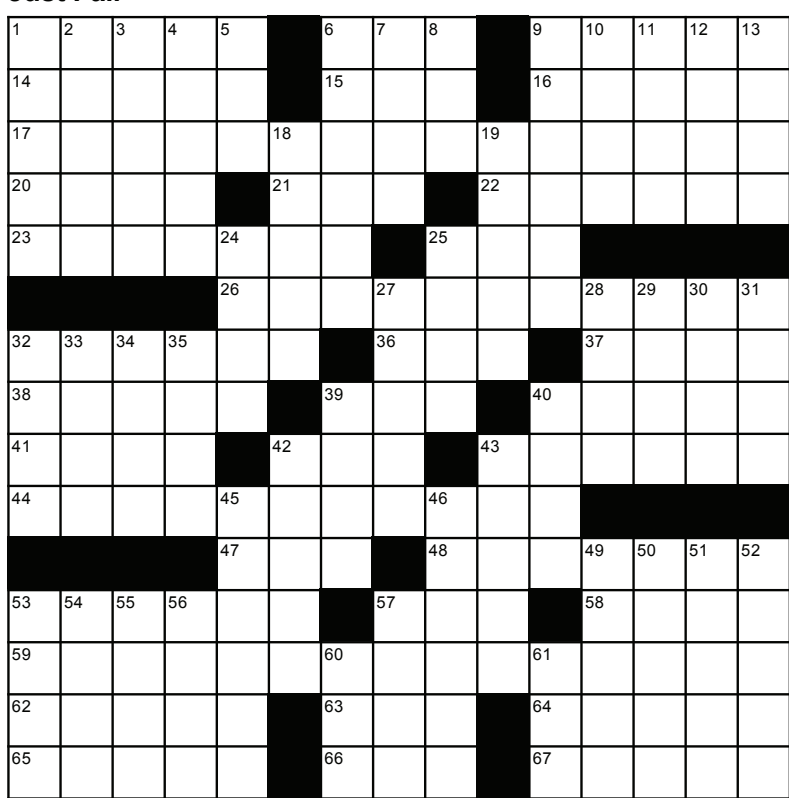
Next Sunday Pastor Wright will be giving his annual "baseball" sermon. You are welcome to come to worship in your favorite baseball regalia!

Opera singer to perform in Colby

World renowned opera singer and native of Colby, Sam Ramey, will present a vocal concert on Sunday at 3 p.m. at the Colby Community Building.

For over three decades, Samuel Ramey has reigned as one of the music world's foremost interpreters of bass and bass-baritone operatic and concert repertoire. With astounding versatility he commands an impressive breadth of repertoire encompassing virtually every musical style from the rinaltura of Argante in Handel's *Rinaldo*, which was the vehicle of his acclaimed Metropolitan Opera debut in 1984, to

the dramatic proclamations of the title role in Bartok's *Bluebeard's Castle*, which he sang in a new production at the Metropolitan Opera televised by Public Broadcasting Station (PBS). Mr. Ramey's interpretations embrace the bel canto of Bellini, Rossini, and Donizetti; the lyric and dramatic roles of Mozart and Verdi; and the heroic roles of the Russian and French repertoire.

Samuel Ramey has appeared on the stages of the Metropolitan Opera, Teatro alla Scala, Royal Opera, Covent Garden, Vienna Staatsoper, Opéra de Paris, Arena di Verona, Deutsche Oper

Berlin, San Francisco Opera, Lyric Opera of Chicago, Houston Grand Opera, the operas of Munich, Hamburg, Geneva, Florence, Zürich and Amsterdam, among others. In concert, he has performed with the London Philharmonic Orchestra, New York Philharmonic, Boston Symphony Orchestra, Berlin Philharmonic, Vienna Philharmonic, La Scala Orchestra, National Symphony Orchestra, and the symphonies of Chicago, Philadelphia, Cleveland, and San Francisco.

As a native of Colby, Samuel Ramey was active in music throughout high school and college. In 1995 he was named "Kansan of the Year," and in 1998 the French Ministry of Culture awarded him the rank of Commander in the Order of Arts

and Letters. He now makes his home in Chicago and through appearances in venues worldwide, he maintains a non-stop schedule of more than 70 performances each season.

Mr. Ramey will be accompanied by Mr. Warren Jones, a guest artist at Carnegie Hall and in Lincoln Center's "Great Performers Series."

Western Plains Arts Association presents this concert and will host a public reception immediately following the performance so you may greet Mr. Ramey and Mr. Jones, enjoy refreshment and cookies, and help them celebrate the association's 40th anniversary. Admission for the concert is season ticket, and, if room for general admission.

A public hearing for Resolution 10-04 will be held at 9 a.m. on Thursday, April 15, in the Commissioners' Room in the Cheyenne County Courthouse.

RESOLUTION 10-04

A RESOLUTION OF DECLARATION OF MINIMUM MAINTENANCE ROADS WITHIN THE COUNTY OF CHEYENNE, STATE OF KANSAS

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is the governing body of Cheyenne County, Kansas; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has statutory authority pursuant to the provision of K.S.A. 68-5,102, and are of the opinion that certain roads in Cheyenne County should be declared minimum maintenance roads; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has reviewed certain roads in all districts of the county and have determined that these roads should be posted as "Minimum Maintenance, travel at your own risk."

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Cheyenne County, Kansas that the following road within Cheyenne County, Kansas, be posted as a minimal maintenance road:

BEGINNING at the northwest corner of Section 36, Township 3 South, Range 42 West, thence three miles south, then one mile east ending at the northeast corner of Section 13, Township 4 South, Range 42 West.

BEGINNING at the northwest corner of the southwest quarter of Section 7, Township 4 South, Range 42 West, thence running south for almost two miles and ending at the intersection of the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 19, Township 4 South, Range 42 West.

BEGINNING at the northwest corner of Section 11, Township 4 South, Range 42 West, thence going east approximately 4,000 feet, thence southeast 1,425 feet ending at Road 4 in the northeast quarter of same said section.

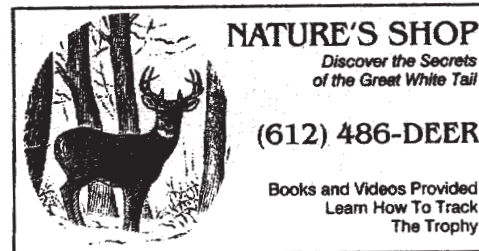
