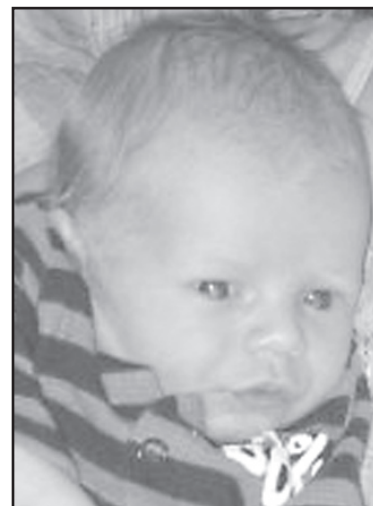
presented the prizes. "The Bowl For Kids Sake is the largest fund raiser we put on during the year," said Mrs. Wellmann. "And this year was a great year."

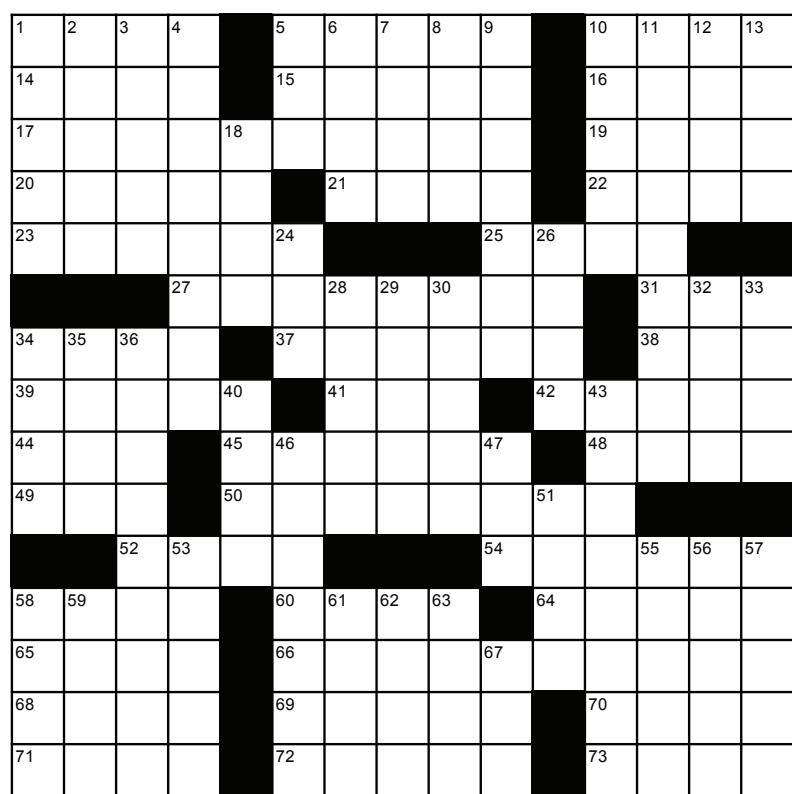
