

A smoke alarm will typically have an eight- to 10-year life span, said Bruce Snead, Kansas State University Research and Extension residential energy specialist. If an alarm is wired into the

electrical system (with or without a battery back-up), a replacement should be installed by an electrician; if a battery-operated alarm, a homeowner often can install a replacement with tools such as a screwdriver.

Some newer models have adhesive backs and can be installed without tools.




