Hospital offers smoking cessation program

Each year, more than 6 million smokers are hospitalized in the United States. These smokers may be at particularly high risk of suffering complications related to their smoking.

Although many of these smokers will try to quit, most will go back to smoking during the days and weeks after they come home from the hospital. New methods

are needed to help these smokers stay quit after they leave the hospital.

Cheyenne County Hospital and the University of Kansas Medical Center have joined forces in a unique research project to identify better ways to help hospitalized smokers quit. Over the next two years, smokers hospitalized at Cheyenne County Hospital

will be offered the opportunity to participate in this program.

Participants will receive telephone counseling from a Tobacco Treatment Specialist at the University of Kansas. Some participants will also receive individualized case management to assist them in the use of medications to help them quit smoking. Thirty rural critical access

hospitals throughout the state of Kansas will participate in this innovative project.

Hospitalized smokers wishing to participate should ask their nurse about the program, entitled Kan Quit II. A Tobacco Treatment Specialist from the University of Kansas will then contact the patient to determine eligibility.

Volunteers are busy preparing for the fair

It is just 10 weeks until the Cheyenne County Fair opens and it could take all of that time before the Amusement Authority is ready for the carnival to open.

This is a year where there is a lot to do and a lot of expenses, said Greg Walz, Amusement Authority member.

The Authority members have been trying to work for the last few months (they meet at the fairgrounds on Thursday evenings) but it has been cold and/or wet.

Thursday, there were a few members working but they are those who are always working.

"We need help," said De Etta Knorr, member.

Before a ride is ready for the fair, it is checked to see that it is running properly. Sometimes there are repairs to the motors, chains, seats or game booths.

This year, Mr. Walz said there are a number of repairs. The train motor has already been overhauled but the merry-go-round and Ferris wheel needs motor repairs.

The Ferris wheel cogs needed replacing. For 12 of them, it cost \$2,200 and they still needed to be painted to pro-

tect them from the elements and make them look better. That was what Susie Walz was working on Thursday evening.

The Authority members plan to run cement under part of the game booths when the weather warms up.

By the end of July, there is a great deal of painting to be done. It isn't painting which takes a lot of skill, work or time. There is painting for anyone who can use a 2-in paint brush. There are fences, game booths, and rides which need painting.

This year, the swing and octopus rides need new covers on the seats. The material has arrived but someone needs to put it on.

With all the rain, there is constant mowing. Trees need to be sprayed and trunks wrapped.

The Authority members and other volunteers meet at 7 p.m. on Thursdays, weather permitting. Even if the weather isn't too good, there may be work that can be done inside.

The carnival is made possible with volunteer help. Volunteers don't have to work any set time. If they can work one evening, that helps. Just show up, said Mrs. Walz.
