High school golf team travels to regional meet

On the sunny afternoon of May 17, The high school golf team competed at the Regional Golf Meet in Mankato. There were five teams vying for the chance to go to state: Beloit-St. John's, Cheylin, Downs-Lakeside, Mankato-Rock Hills, and Tipton. The top two teams, as well as the next three highest individual scores,

advanced to the state meet. Two Cheylin golfers placed at the regional meet: Wil Orten was caught in a three-way tie for 10th place, and David Burns placed ninth, which qualified him for the state meet in Luray, on May 24. David golfed well at the state meet, and placed 12th out of 35 golfers.

Final meet of the season held

For their final meet of the season, The Cheylin junior high track team traveled to Scott City to compete in the Freedom League track meet on May 14.

The athletes did very well, bringing home seven first place medals, and breaking two school records. Mary Anne Orten broke the seventh grade girls 100-meter hurdles record, and Shayla Hubbard broke the record for the eighth grade girls 1600-meter run.

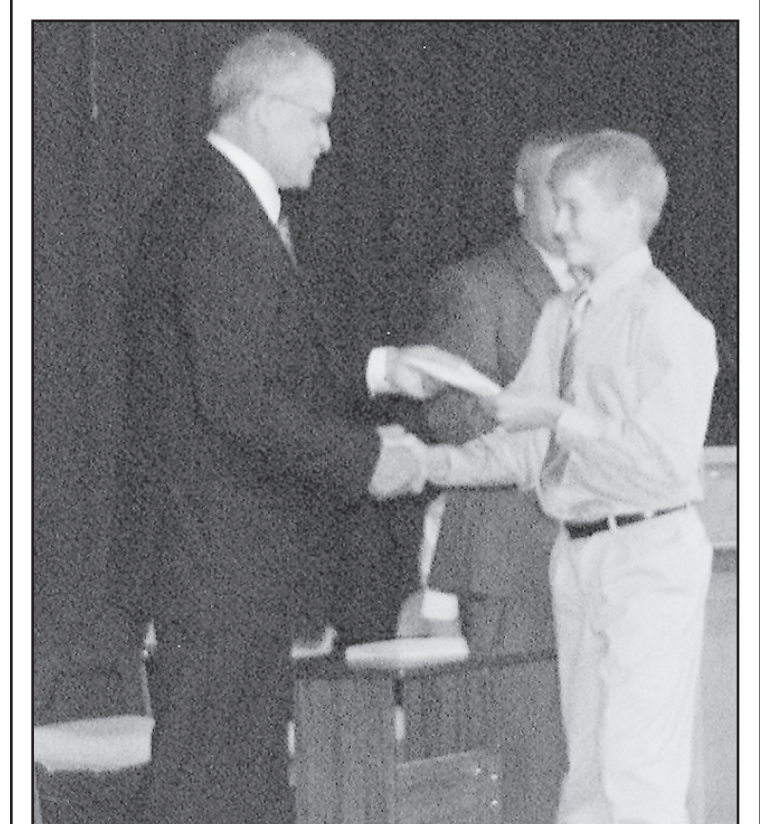

Expanding Frosting
