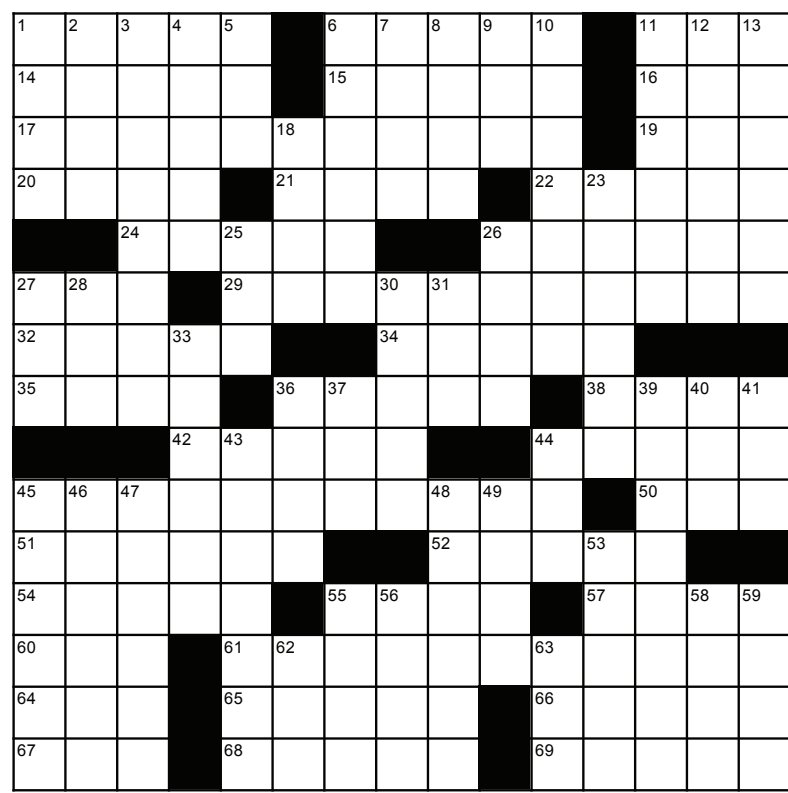
Sophi Zuege was pleased to have a cousin, Wilma Bartlet from Lincoln, and her family visit her on Sunday. They were from different towns in the state
