County and city representatives gather for meeting

karen.k@nwkansas.com Several months ago, the Cheyenne County Commissioners and the St. Francis City Council agreed to meet every other month. The second meeting was held before the regular commissioners' meeting on Friday.

They discussed recycling, the new playground equipment in the park behind the courthouse, road funding, property clean up and possibly more sharing of law enforcement patrol. No decisions were made.

Those present from the city council were Bruce Swihart, Dale Weeks, Roger Jensen and Carla Lampe, as well as Scott Schultz, mayor. Those representing the county were Andy Beikman, Ernie Ketzner and Dale Patton, commissioners; Kari Gilliland, county attorney; and Terry Miller, clerk.

The regular commissioners' meeting began at 8 a.m. and Mila Bandel, county health nurse, told the commissioners that there were 13 employees who had attended at least one-half of the wellness checks from February 2009 until May 2010.

Six employees, she said, had taken the physical test both years. She encouraged all county employees to take part in the

The commissioners agreed to allow the millings and the county's application, but they asked that Attorney Gilliland draw up an agreement relieving the county of future maintenance once the millings are intact.


