 Knowing how important reading is in the learning process, the St. Francis teachers, each year, encourage students to read through the Accelerated Reader Program.

"The Accelerated Reader Program is a valuable tool that encourages kids to read," said Sandy Smull, reading chairman. "It targets reading comprehension.

"This program is one of the big reasons that our school's Kansas Reading Assessment scores are so high."

The reading program, she said, has been very successful again this year. There were 73 students recognized that ended the year with an 86 percent (B- or higher) comprehension scores.

"Super job to those readers!" Mrs. Smull said.

The top reader was Sophie White with 217.7 points. To be a top reader for the entire grade school, Sophie needed to have over 200 points with a comprehension score of 86 percent or higher.

She received a certificate and two movie passes with refreshments for her and a friend.
