The Rednecks and Red Dirt concert is set for Saturday, June 12, 4 miles south and 2 miles east of Wheeler. The gates open at 1 p.m. and the first performance begins at 2. There will be six acts total with the last show going up to around midnight.

There will be at-the-gate admission but people can go on line to buy in advance. See the ad in this week's issue of *The Herald*. Inside the gates, there will be barbecue food, beer and other various concessions. Everyone is encouraged to bring their chair as there is no seating provided.

The entertainment was coordinated by local guy, Justin McAtee, and his friend, Matt Wilson, formerly from Oakley, now of Southlake, Texas. Their first concert was held in October and it was so successful, that they decided to host a second, and, hopefully, many more.

"A big reason why we are so excited about Rednecks and Red Dirt is the music itself, said Mr. Wilson, who is the manager for The Backroad Drifters.

"I know growing up in Western Kansas, most everyone listened to either country music or classic rock. I would venture a guess that 75 percent of the population would say their favorite music was one of those two genres."

They were a fairly new band, but Mr. McAtee really liked them and wanted somehow to get them to come to Northwest Kansas for a show.

"It seemed like a tall order at the time, so we shelved the idea," Mr. Wilson said.
