When worn correctly, safety belts have proven to reduce the risk of fatal injury to front-seat passenger car occupants by 45 percent - and by 60 percent in pickup trucks, SUVs and minivans. That research becomes significant when coupled with Kansas Department of Transportation statistics showing that only 30 percent of people killed in motor vehicle crashes in 2008 were buckled in at the time of the

Currently, Kansas' safety belt use rate is 77 percent, which is one of the lowest in the nation (43rd out of 50 states) and well below the national average of 84
