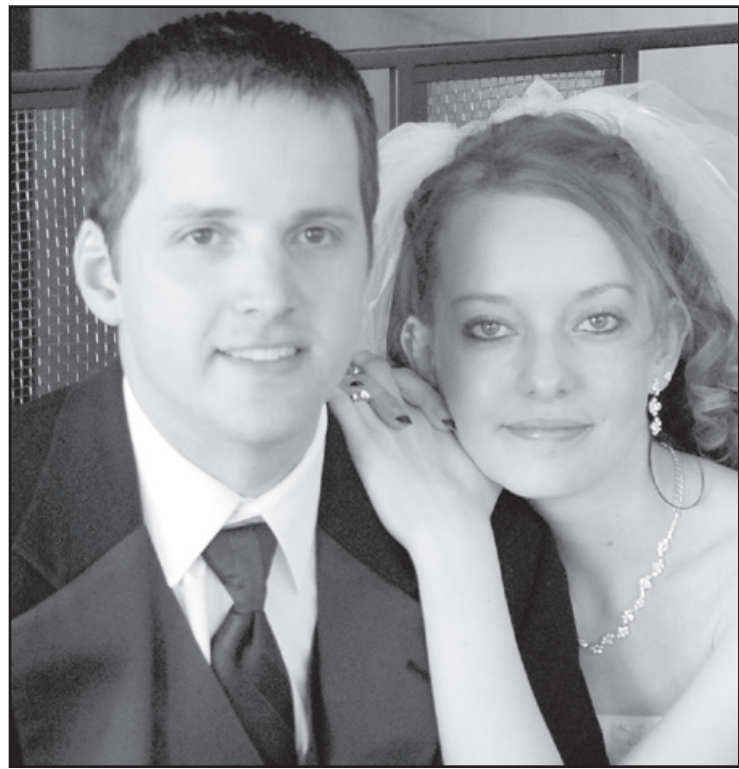
A reception and dinner was held for family and friends following

Parents of the couple are Ben and Pat Leibbrandt of St. Francis and John and Thelma Thomas of Admire.

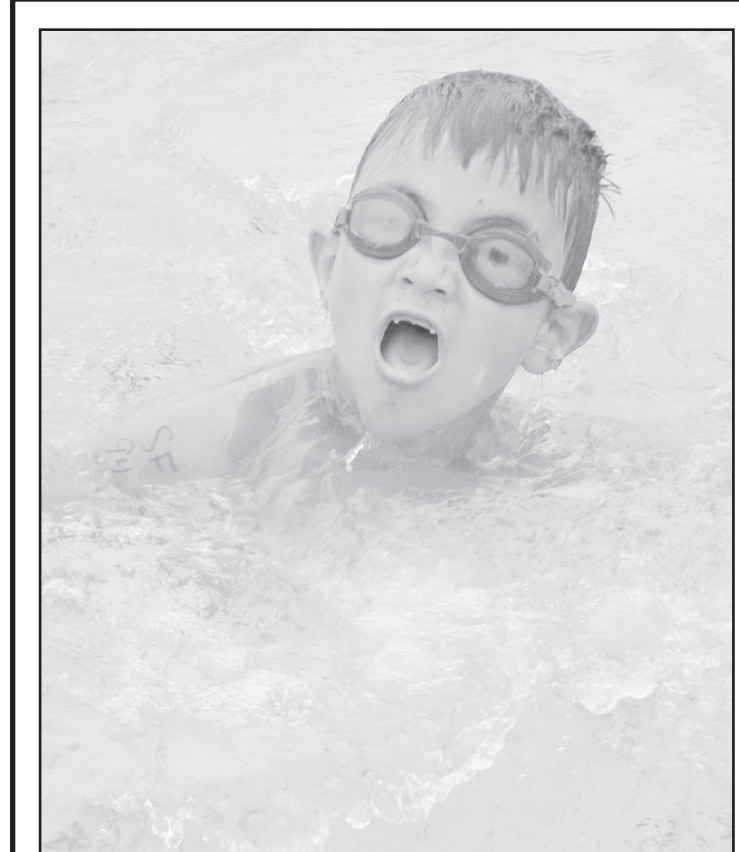
Book Review
