Councilman accepts bid for purchase of property

The sale of less than acre of industrial park land to Roger Jensen, councilman, was once again on the June 26 St. Francis City Council agenda after being tabled at the last meeting. Carla Lampe, council woman and member of the Economic Development organization, said the land was purchased for development of businesses. Bruce Swihart, councilman, said he had looked at the land and couldn't see where it was worth \$5,000. He said he thought it was too much money and it didn't make any difference if it were for Mr. Jensen or any other person wanting to put a business on it.

There were several stipulations which will need to be met but Mr. Jensen said he was still willing to purchase the property for \$2,000. The council accepted the offer.
