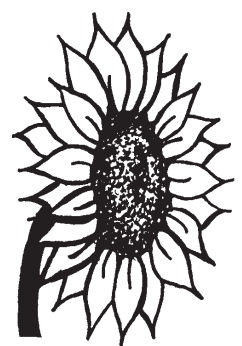

## Basketball tournament results

The basketball season is over for this summer. The tournament games of the Atwood Summer League were played the last week of June.

In boys action, St. Francis placed second, losing in the championship game to Hitchcock County, after defeating Cheylin I.

The girls ended the season with a loss to Hitchcock County, in game two of the tournament. Hitchcock County was the eventual champion in the final game with Atwood. Earlier in the tournament, St. Francis had defeated Cheylin.

The boys team received a compliment from a referee following the tournament. Coach Ron Zwegardt said he was approached by a referee who complimented St. Francis on their sportsmanship. He said that every year he had worked the games, St. Francis

had made a good impression on him.

## Boys league

St. Francis advanced to the championship game and ended the season in second place. They were defeated by Hitchcock County, the number one seed. Hitchcock had lost only one game this summer and that was to St. Francis early in the season.

Isaac Schiltz collected 27 points to lead the team to victory. Dylan Peter was also in double-figures with 14.

"St. Francis led throughout the game and the guys did a good job," Coach Zwegardt said.

Figgins with 8 points, Zach Zwegardt 4, Ty Zwegardt 2 and Brett Lampe 1. Also contributing were Gavin Cooper and Brock Zwegardt.

## Hitchcock County 44, St. Francis 34

"We got behind early and never could catch up," Coach Zwegardt said.

Peter was the leading scorer in this contest with 12 points. He was followed by Schiltz with 9, Figgins, Z. Zwegardt and T. Zwegardt with 4 points each.

"Numbers were our biggest problem this year," Coach Kelly Hilt said. "During the tournament we had only five players. This gave no one a rest and we ended up very tired and sluggish in the second game."

He also said the two younger players, Clarice Neitzel and Laura Brunk, had done well and played hard during the season. They were

playing with varsity players and learning a lot.

"The girls played really good in this game," Coach Hilt said. "We had a lot of fast breaks and the defense was great."

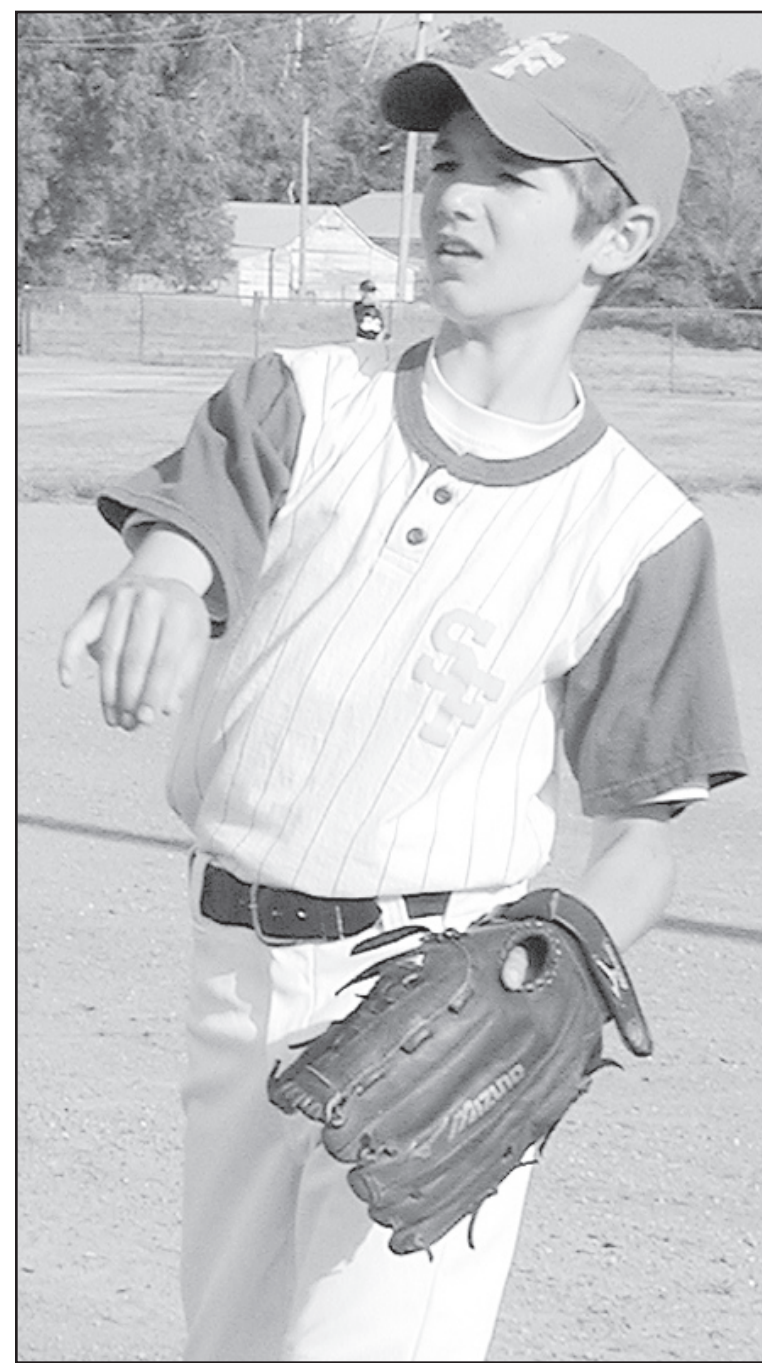
Neitzel led the scoring with 18 points, including a number from fast break situations.

## Shrine Bowl activities July 31

St. Francis Community High School has been represented in Kansas Shrine Bowl All-Star football games through the years. This year, St. Francis Indian Trent Raile will be a member of the West team.

Another Shrine Bowl tradition, the 26th annual Masonic All-State Marching Band, will involve several hundred young people from all parts of the Sunflower State. St. Francis Community High School musicians, Logan Whitmore and Sarah Whitmore, will be involved in the band.

Proceeds from all Shrine Bowl events support the Shriners Hospitals for Children, a network of 22 hospitals that provide expert, no-cost orthopedic, burn, and spinal care to children under 18.

With warmer weather and summer activities taking center stage in Kansas, a dozen football coaches, 68 of the Sunflower State's best graduated football players, dozens of Shriners, high school musicians and countless volun-

teers are turning their attention to the Kansas Shrine Bowl All-Star football game.

The 37th annual event will be played on Brandenburg Field at Carnie Smith Stadium on the campus of Pittsburg State University.

The Shrine Bowl weekend of activities will include many events that attendees look forward to seeing each year. Among them is the annual Kansas Shrine Bowl Parade, one of the largest parades in the state, involving hundreds of Shriners riding everything from mini-motorcycles to old cars to scaled-down versions of combines that are so much a part of the Kansas landscape.
