Maybe it's working. A poll by a Wichita television station Sunday showed Mr. Moran leading 50 percent to 36, with 9 percent still undecided, but was a shift of 6 points from Moran to Tiahrt in the last month.

He trumpets an endorsement from anti-immigration poster boy Tom Tancredo, the former Congressman from Colorado whose campaign for president got exactly nowhere two years ago. Former Gov. Sarah Palin is another conservative hero backing Tiahrt.


found out first hand that John Faber is not a friend to education in rural Kansas – period. John Faber has continually voted against legislation that would help sustain our rural schools.
