The luminaria are sacks with candles that are lit at dark at the Relay for Life, scheduled to be held Friday, Aug. 20, at Sawhill Park in St. Francis.

"You can purchase a luminaria in honor of someone who has survived cancer or in memory of someone who did not," said Betty Loudon, member of the committee.

At dark on Aug. 20, it is a very impressive ceremony as survivors go around and light up the hun-

dreds of luminaria all over the park.

Money collected by the Relay teams go to support the American Cancer Society and it's fight to cure cancer. Some of those funds stay in the county to support patients in their fight.

The Relay teams camp out at the park and have a team member walk around the park all night to symbolize the tremendous battle a person has with cancer, the midnight hours in the dark and all walk toward the dawn, which symbolizes the coming of a new day and victory.

Accidents cause minor injuries

There were two accidents within the last week which happened in the county.

The first accident happened at the corner of U.S. 36 and Rd 29 east of Bird City. Don Wright, 63, driving a Dodge pickup, was south bound on Rd. 29 when he failed to yield at the intersection and drove in front of a 1996 Chevy pickup driven by Craig Busse, 17, Bird City.

Sheriff Craig Van Allen said the airbags in the Busse pickup deployed as he hit the driver's side of the Wright pickup.

Both were wearing seat belts which, Sheriff Van Allen said, kept either men from suffering any serious injuries.

Busse ended up with a broken wrist. Mr. Wright was taken to the Cheyenne County Hospital by ambulance and released with only

minor injuries.

A roll-over accident happened about 7 a.m. on Saturday 7 miles west of St. Francis on U.S. 36. Darren Laffond, 21, St. Francis, was driving a 2008 Toyota pickup when he swerved to keep from hitting deer. He lost control of the pickup, went off the road and rolled. Sheriff Van Allen said Laffond was wearing a seat belt and the airbags deployed which saved the driver from any serious injuries.

At around 10 p.m. on Saturday evening in St. Francis, Karla Zwegardt backed a 2005 Pontiac out of her driveway, across the street and in to a parked 2001 Ford pickup owned by David Hankins of Bethune, Colo. The accident happened on South Quincy Street. The sheriff reported only light damage to the vehicles.
