

There is already a lot of excitement about the derby, said Clay Zimbelman, Derby Committee chairman. To qualify to run in the Championship Derby, the driver will need to place first, second or third in one of the participating shows. See related article.

New Championship Derby New this year is the Champion-

ship Demolition Derby which will be held at the Tri-County Fairground in Herington on Oct. 9. The Cheyenne County Fair Board voted to have the derby held here Saturday be one of the 31 participating derbies.

Clay Zimbelman, fair board member and Demolition Derby Committee head, reports that the derby will be a part of a state-wide effort to crown the best derbier in the state.

The Championship Demolition Derby Association was created to bring the top drivers from across the state and surrounding states, to complete in a championship derby. The association is focused on promoting a first class event with quality rules, inspection and officiating in a non-biased environment.

Not just any driver can compete, said Mr. Zimbelman. "Only drivers that qualify at one of the 31 association derbies in the state are eligible."

In order to qualify, each driver must place either first, second or third in one of the shows listed

"We have already had good response," Mr. Zimbelman said.

This year, there will be only one class — the modified hobo. "This levels the playing field," he said.
