## Player goes to Shrine Bowl

Trent Raile of St. Francis finished his high school football career in Pittsburg on July 31 playing in the Kansas Shrine Bowl. This is an invitation-only game for the top 68 senior football players in the state. He was one of the contributors to the West's 45-29 victory.

"I was the starting safety for the West and played in every defensive series," he said. "I got a lot of playing time and was also a member of the punting team."

It was a busy week for everyone involved. The first day the players and coaches had an opportunity to meet everyone and participate in the initial practice. The West sessions were held at St. John's Military School in Salina, while the East coaches and players trained at Emporia

State University in Emporia. Raile had said before he left that he had been working out every night this summer and felt pretty good about the shape he was in.

One of the highlights of the week is always the trip to the Shriner's Children Hospital in St. Louis.

"We took a train from Kansas City to the hospital," said Raile.

"It was a real eye opener seeing what the kids were going through. They seemed to have such a positive attitude."

The remainder of the week the players had a three-a-day practice one day and the rest of the time they had two-a-day.

"On Friday morning we moved to Pittsburg for our final preparations before the game on Saturday," he said.

The Shrine Bowl Banquet was held on Friday night.

"This was a really cool experience," said Raile. "It was really big and a fun time with all the players from both teams meeting and everyone being introduced."

The pre-game parade on Saturday is also a traditional experience.

"There were a lot of people along the street watching the parade," he said. "It was fun."

He said the Shriners had made the week a good experience. They had been fed well and had a nice place to stay.

Everything led up to the big

football game on Saturday.

"It was really exciting," he said. "The two teams were pretty evenly matched but we won 45-29."

The West had a 21-0 advantage in the game before the East woke up and found the scoreboard. The result was a 28-14 West lead going into the fourth quarter.

The game became very exciting when East rallied from 14 points down to take the lead 29-28. First they scored on a fourth-down touchdown run with a two-point conversion pass set up by a West fumble. Later a blocked field goal let the East get back in the game on a touchdown pass.

Now the West was down by one point but they answered the challenge. First they scored on 17-yard run and collected two points on the conversion, then they added two points on a safety and ended the game with a 3-yard run and a successful kick.

This was the fifth straight win for the West.
