The deadlines for purchasing insurance with Farm Service Agency (FSA) under the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) for this year crops have been established. Sept. 1 is the deadline for all small grain crops, except oats, barley and continuous crop wheat planted with the inten-

tion of harvesting as grain. Crops included would include wheat for hay or graze or triticale for hay, graze or grain. Crops eligible for Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program benefits are limited to those not insurable "downtown" in the county, such as forage crops for livestock (me-

chanically harvested or grazed). To participate in the program, you must visit the Farm Service Agency office and pay the service fee by the sales closing date for the specific crop. Service fees of \$250 per crop per administrative county not to exceed \$750 per producer per administrative county with a

\$1875 maximum fee for multi-county producers are collected. In the unfortunate event you suffer a loss on your crop, a Notice of Loss must be filed with the Farm Service Agency office within 15 calendar days after the disaster occurrence, or the date the loss becomes apparent to the producer.

This coverage entitles eligible you to a payment of 55 percent of an average market price for the commodity if a natural disaster caused a 50-percent production loss or greater of an eligible crop. Additionally, having all your crops insured is also a requirement of the new SURE (Supplemental Revenue Assistance) Program. Contact the Farm Service Agency office at 785-332-2183 to purchase this crop insurance.
