Excitement mounts as football season begins

Four returning letter winners step on the football field this fall after having received Northwest Kansas League honors following the 2009 season. They are Adam Guthmiller, who was honored as a first team defensive linebacker and second team offensive tackle; Cody Sherlock, who was honored as a second team running back; Brooks Hobrock, who was honored as a second team defensive tackle and offensive tackle and Garrett Figgins, who received honorable mention as an offensive tight end. All of the athletes are seniors.

Guthmiller and Sherlock also have a year of experience as team captains. There were four of them last year, two juniors and two seniors. Joining Guthmiller and terback and Sherlock will be return-Sherlock as captains this year will be Figgins and a sophomore, Zach Gienger.

"To have a sophomore chosen as a team captain shows his level of commitment," said Coach Nate Smith.

"I am excited about the upcoming season," Coach Smith said. "We have great community support and a quality group of kids, including the seniors who are proving to be great leaders.'

St. Francis opens play Friday night when they entertain Colby in the first of four non-district games.

"Colby had a 7-3 winning record last year," Coach Smith said. "They have 35 letter winners and have a number of good quality kids"
