

The St. Francis City Cleanup is set for Thursday, Oct. 20, but there is a deadline of Oct. 14 for residents to call in to have their items picked up.

Those residents having items to be picked up need to call the power plant at 785-332-3031. Anyone calling after the Oct. 14 deadline will need to wait a year until the next fall cleanup. Those calling too late last fall and still have items to be picked up need to call again before the deadline.

Without a call, the city crew is not authorized to pick up items, even if they are beside the trash container.

Items to be hauled away must be accessible. That is next to the alley or street; not behind fences, bushes, utility meters or poles.
