Disc golf course set at roadside park

St. FFancis has a new entertain-
ment. People have been talking
about those metal baskets and
signs at the roadside park near
the Cheyenne County Museum on
U.S. 36.
The baskets and signs are a part
of the Frisbie (or disc) golf course
which was recently completed by
Kary Zweygardt and his son, Jor-
dan. It is also sponsored through
Zero's, the youth center located on
Main Street east of the post office.
The money used for the equip-
ment was raised through private
donations and the St. Francis Rec-
reation Commission.
Frisbie golf is played much like
traditional goff. Instead of balls
and clubs, players use a flying disc
or a Frisbie. The object of golf is
to complete each hole in the least
number of strokes. In Frisbie golf,
the object is the same except the throws.
The disc is thrown from a tee
area to a golf target a metal basket area to a golf target, a metal basket
mounted on a pole.
The St Francis The St. Francis course is a nine-
hole course. It has trees, shrubs and hole course.It has trees, shrubs and
terrain changes which provides
challenges for the participant challenges for the participant.
When the disc lands in the basket, the hole is completed. There are no green fees, players don't have to rent a cart and they never get stuck with a bad "tee time."
