Young football team wins big

The junior varsity football team won big on Monday, Oct 18, when they met the Rawlins County Buffaloes. The final score was Indians 46, Buffs 6.

Sainty scored at least once in every quarter and twice in the second and third periods. The Buffs added their touchdown on an 8-yard pass play in the final period.

Scoring for St. Francis in the first quarter were Thomas Douthit on a 2-yard run and Dylan Wolaver on a 35-yard run for a total of 12 points.

Wolaver scored twice in second

quarter, once on a 3-yard run and once on a 34-yard run. Wyatt Landenberger had a good conversion run after the 3-yard run. The score was 26-0 at halftime.

The third quarter had a 48-yard run by Wolaver and a 31-yard run by Landenberger with Keegan Sherlock adding two points after the Landenberger score.

The final score of the game came on a 31-yard run by Sherlock. This gave the Indians their total of 46 points.

Five of these touchdowns were the result of break-away runs of over 30-yards.

They were scheduled for 10:20 but it was 11:30 when they started.

"I ended up being nervous when it was time to play," McCauley said. "But I was pleased with how I played on this terrible course."

"I could have done better on the front nine (53) but came back and did better on the back nine (47)."

Three different players scored a 100 so it was necessary to have a playoff. She said they used one par three hole as it was getting dark and chilly. The first time she and one other player came in with a par so the third player who had an extra stroke was eliminated. The second time on the hole both remaining player again had a par three so they needed to go a third time. This was when McCauley with her consistency again scored a par three, while her opponent did not par the hole. This gave her fifth place.

"I was really pleased to be able to golf with the Colby team this last season," she said.
