Coach selected to be inducted

Larry Gabel, former Indian wrestling coach and St. Francis Elementary School principal, is one of five individuals selected for induction into the Kansas State High School Activities Hall of Fame Class of 2011. Mr. Gabel is now associated with the Colby High School.

Also being inducted are Raymond Patterson, Burdett, Larry Schroeder, Frankfort, Don Steffens, Andover and Kendra Wecker, Norman, Okla.

From 1974 through 2005, Coach Gabel's influence in the sport of wrestling (Class 3-2-1A) at St. Francis Community High School is known statewide in all classes: six state championships and 16 combined second through sixth place team finishes. He coached 34 individual state champions, 76 individual finishers (second through fourth place) and 11 fifth and sixth place finishers. Northwest Kansas and strong wrestling programs go hand-inhand.

Coach Gabel combined an overall dual record of 205-104-10 at St. Francis.

Some of his many honors: named 3-2-1A Coach of the year five times, Kansas Wrestling Coach of the Year (all classes) two times, and Regional Coach of the Year (six states) in 2001.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Mr. Gabel served as the elementary grade school principal for 23 years and for over 25 years served on the community's emergency medical service team.

Awards will be presented during 2011 in conjunction with a Kansas State High School Activities Association-sponsored state function/championship or locally, at the inductee's request.

The honorees were chosen from nomination sent to the Selection Committee. To be eligible for the Hall of Fame, an individual must have made an unusually outstanding contribution in interschool activities, either as a student with exceptional talent, or as an adult working with youth (such as an activity coach, director or sponsor, an administrator, an official or a contributor). Hall of Fame inductees may no longer The St. Francis Invitational be active in the field for which Wrestling Tournament now bears they are nominated (exception: contributor with over 30 years of outstanding service).

The Hall of Fame is housed in the Kansas State High School Activities Association office, 601 SW Commerce Place in Topeka and is open Monday through Friday during business hours.
