Six wrestlers travel to Topeka Saturday

The St. Francis Wrestling club had 11 wrestlers in the District IV Championship held in Pratt on Saturday. There were six of them that will be going on to the 2011 Kansas State Folkstyle Championships in Topeka this weekend.

Luke Lampe and Garrett Brunk both won first place. Luke Lampe won his first match by a 12-0 major decision; second match was a 6-4 exciting overtime win and won 5-0 to win first. Brunk won by forfeit first match, won by 6-0 decision and in his match for first he pinned his kid in 48 seconds to win.

Others advancing include Logan Lampe, Zach Gienger, Lane Hoffman and Derek Queen.

"It was another exciting weekend of wrestling for the young Indians," Nathan Smith, coach said.

"We finished with two champions in Garrett Brunk and Luke Lampe. Both wrestled exceptionally well defeating quality kids on their way to winning their respective weights.

"Zach Gienger and Logan Lampe both finished third in the high school division. Zach handled his first opponent and lost what was a close match until a late fall in the semi's.

"Logan is a young guy battling older wrestlers and competing well.

"Lane Hoffman and Derek

Queen round out the state qualifiers.

"The other wrestlers battled hard all weekend with two wrestlers finishing a match away from qualifying and most of the other loses were to state qualifiers. I'm really looking forward to watching our kids compete against the best wrestlers in the state next weekend."

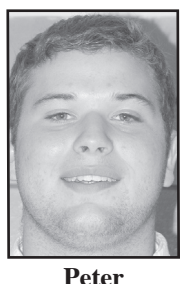
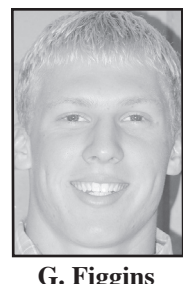

All-league players honored

Northwest Kansas League basketball coaches have released the names of those players receiving league honors following the completion of the season.

St. Francis Indian Isaac Schiltz, junior, was named to the All-League team and Garrett Figgins, senior, and Dylan Peter, sophomore, received honorable mention.

For the Lady Indians, Kaitlin Figgins, a junior, earned a position on the second team, and Sarah Trembly, a senior, received honorable mention. After the 2010 season, K. Figgins received honorable mention.

Indians

There were 11 players, including Schiltz, who received first team honors and four additional players, including Figgins and Peter, who received honorable mention.

Schiltz averaged 18.5 points per game for a total of 388 points and 3.3 rebounds per game for a total of 69. He led the team in points scored and also had the best free-throw percentage. His field-goal percentage was 52 percent and his free-throw percentage was 60 percent.

Figgins averaged 10.5 points per game for a total of 211 points and 5.6 rebounds per game for a total of 117. He led the team in field-goal percentage, which was 61 percent. His free-throw percentage was 50 percent.

Peter averaged 9.9 points per game for a total of 207 points and 8.3 rebounds per game for

a total of 175. He led the team in rebounds and blocked shots. His field goal percentage was 51 percent and his free-throw percentage was 54 percent.

"I thought all three of these young men were deserving of the recognition from the league coaches," Coach Jeff Beims said. "They have worked hard to improve their game, and I think their willingness to do the little things on a basketball court impressed other coaches as it has me.

"We tend to look only at the points a player scored as a measure of his value to a team. His ability to score is only one small part of the equation of what it takes to make this list."

Lady Indians

Coaches for the ladies chose five members for the first team, five members for the second team including Figgins and two additional players for honorable mention, with Trembly being one of the two.

Figgins averaged 9.3 points per game for a total of 195 points and 6.0 rebounds per game for a total of 125. She led the team in points scored and in rebounds. Her field goal percentage was 43 percent and her free-throw percentage was 57 percent.

Trembly averaged 8.3 points per game for a total of 174 points and 2.2 rebounds per game for a total of 47. She led the team in assists, steals and free-throw percentage. Her field goal percentage was 31 percent and her free-throw percentage was 74 percent.

"These are two, well-deserved honors for these young women," Coach Susan Dinkel said. "Kaitlin has the potential to be a dominating post in our league and Sarah has probably put more time into improving her basketball skills than any other player on our team.

"On a team of only 12 in the Northwest Kansas League, with two of the teams going to state, it's definitely an honor to be placed in this group."
