Mr. Lohr said the U.S. Geological Survey found that some \$20 billion in damages each year can be linked to invasive weeds. This affects not only those who make their living directly off the land, but also the citizens of cities, suburbs and rural America. The herbicide helps control or eliminate these plants.

It is important, he said, to note that not all non-native plants are invasive but those that are can cause significant and costly consequences. 
