



University alumni honors students

Christopher Walden of Cheylin High School and Mikaela Grace, Brooks Hobrock and Cody Sherlock of St. Francis Community High School are among students from 15 Kansas high schools who were honored on Wednesday, April 6, by the University of Kansas Alumni Association and Kansas University Endowment.

A total of 48 seniors from high schools in Cheyenne, Decatur, Gove, Logan, Rawlins, Sheridan, Sherman, Thomas and Wallace counties were recognized for their academic achievements and named Kansas Honor Scholars at a 7 p.m. dinner and program at the Gateway Civic Center in Oberlin.

The Kansas Honors Program celebrates its 40th anniversary this year. Since 1971, the program has recognized 114,000 scholars, who ranked in the top 10 percent of their

high school senior classes and are selected regardless of occupational plans or high-education goals. Each year, the Kansas University Alumni Association and its volunteers host 41 programs that reach all 105 counties across the state.

During the ceremony, each student received an American Heritage Dictionary, in both hardback and electronic versions, presented by Michelle Miles, assistant director of Kansas programs for the Kansas University Alumni Association.

Don Steeples, the McGee Distinguished Professor of Applied Geophysics, spoke to the students and their parents and guests.

Blood drive set in Bird City

On Wednesday, from noon to 4 p.m., many Cheylin High School students will be giving blood for the first time at the Cheylin High School and Bird City community blood drive. The drive will be held in the gym and the students host the drive and participate as first-time donors.

"The Red Cross is asking everyone to share hope with someone in need," said Dawn Gabel, donor recruitment representative for the American Red Cross. "You probably know someone who has needed blood and may not know that they have; but they are people who need you to give. That is the message we send to the students so they understand the chain of need being passed to them as they become adults."

The Bird City Blood Drive has a long tradition of helping the Red Cross meet the need of local hospitals. The goal at the school is 40 donations from both community members and students.

"The goal for a blood drive is actually a reflection of the order for blood at the hospital level." Ms. Gabel said, "There is little room for failure--that is what I tell the kids."

It takes a community to raise a child and the blood drive in the school is part of that community effort. Donors are asked to take a moment and note their appointment time they have already made, or make an appointment by calling 1-800-733-2767 or visit www.redcrossblood.org.

How to donate blood: All blood types are needed to ensure the Red Cross maintains an adequate blood supply. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Donors must be in general good health, weigh at least 110 pounds and be at least 17 years of age (16 in Kansas with parental consent).
