

Cheylin tracksters attend meet at Tribune Saturday

Cheylin competed in a track meet at Tribune/Greeley County on Saturday. The events involved the sixth and seventh graders forming one team and the eighth graders having individual teams.

"Our eighth grade girls took first place at the Greeley County meet," Coach Jolene Reeh said. "The sixth and seventh grade boys and the sixth and seventh grade girls both took third place at the meet.

The kids accomplished nine personal records and two school records, the coach said.

"We took a small team to Tribune, leaving eight athletes at home, but the ones who went had a great day!

"We run this Thursday, May 5, at our home meet that is being rescheduled from April 1," Coach Reeh said. "We finish the season with the league meet Friday, May 13, at Scott City.

The school records were set by Devon Janicke in the triple jump, with a leap of 33-8.5 and Jaime Davison in the shot put with a throw of 34-3/4.

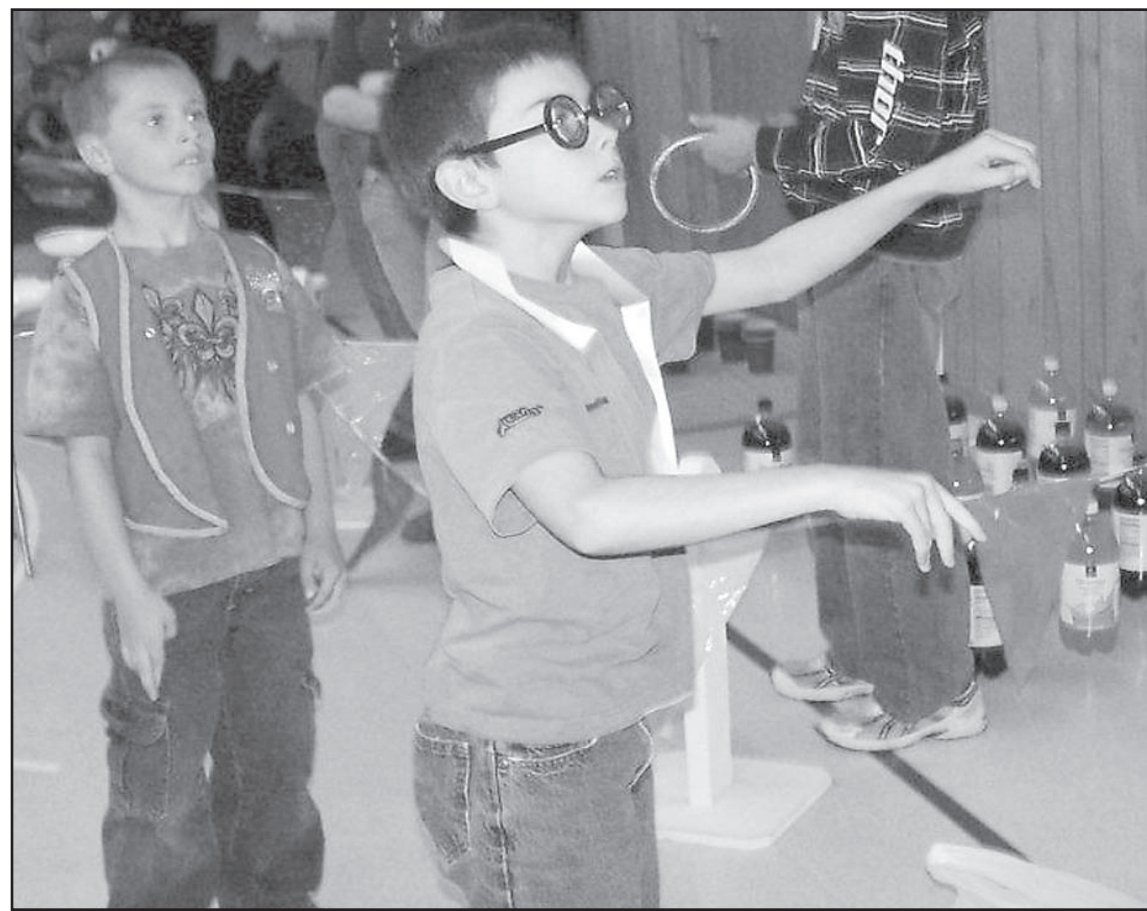
