This Patient Centered Medical Home model was developed in response to the Future of Family Medicine project in early 2000.

The goal was to develop a solution in response to recognized discontent among family physicians, frustrated in their ability to provide the highest quality care for their patients, in the context of health. The Kansas project kicked off Jan. 1 under the collaborative leadership of the Kansas Academy of Family Physicians, Kansas Association of Osteopathic Medicine, Kansas Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, Kansas Chapter of the American College of Physicians, and the Kansas Medical Society.

In April of 2011, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas pledged payer support for the eight-selected pilots.

"Blue Cross is committed to exploring the patient-centered medical home model as we believe this model of care could well be the wave of the future for primary care," said Michael D. Atwood, M.D., chief medical officer for Blue Cross and family physician. "If this pilot proves successful, it may provide a model for possible expansion to the right care at the right time, a wider group of primary care physicians in the near future."
