Board of education accepts gift of memorial money

karen.k@nwkansas.com A memorial gift was accepted with the St. Francis Board of Education met Thursday evening. The family of Bonnie Hill gave \$695 in memorial money which they asked be used in the food service department and used as the schools needed it.

"It is a really nice gift," said Rob Schiltz, superintendent.

Mrs. Hill worked at the school, first as a cook, then as food service manager, supervising both the junior-senior high school as well as the grade school. She retired in 2004 after 28 years.

Mrs. Hill died on June 29 after battling with cancer. Mr. Schiltz said the people

working in the food department will make the decision on what the money will be spent for.

Budget hearing

The budget hearing was held. The budget had been printed in The Saint Francis Herald on July 28 with the date of the hearing included. There was no one present to contest the budget so it was approved.

Gas line request approved

The board discussed a request made by Midwest Energy, Hays, to bring a gas line across school property to the house being built by Cory and Jenny Busse. The line will be put in on school property south of the bus barn on the far east side. The board approved the request.

The discussion then turned to the matter of the road which leads to the Busse property. Some people, several of the board members had heard, are concerned that the road was going to be closed.

Mr. Schiltz said the road is school property and, no, it was not going to be closed. In fact, Mr. Busse had told him that he had obtained an easement on Jim Milliken's land (south of the Busse house) and he will take out some trees and put in a road.

1,116-hour school year

Each year, the board makes the decision on whether to approve a 186-day school year or a 1,116hour school year.

For years, the St. Francis schools have operated on 1,116-hour school year, but, the superintendents have set for 7 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. also said that they will make every 8, in the high school board room. attempt to attend 186 days.

Mr. Schiltz said most, if not all schools in Kansas, use the 1,116-hour school year. The board approved the hourly agreement and the Kansas State Department of Education will be notified.

In other business

In other business: A check for \$71,601 was approved to Norton Glass for the new doors at the high school. There will an additional amount paid for labor. The work on the doors will be done before school starts.

After receiving a letter from Brad and Jessica Matthies, the board approved that their daughter attend the St. Francis Schools and there will be no tuition fees. Policy requires that there is board approval after a request is made.
