Historical Society offers scholarship

The Cheyenne County Historical Society will award a \$500 scholarship to one graduating senior in order to encourage his or her further education and interest in local history.

Applicants must meet four criteria: be a resident of Cheyenne County or schooled in Cheyenne County; have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 at high school graduation; plan to attend a college, university, or vocation-technical school; and submit an application and essay in a large, brown envelope by March 31st to Scott Carmichael at St. Francis Community High School or Anita Burton at Cheylin High School.

Application forms are available from Mr. Carmichael or Mrs. Burton. St. Francis students should be aware that the common application form they usually complete for local scholarships will not be used by the historical society's scholarship committee because they chose to use a form that would be eq-

uitable for both St. Francis and Bird City students.

An essay of 250-300 words should address why it is important to know the history of Cheyenne County. The applicant should not put his or her name on the essay itself because the judges wish to be impartial.

The scholarship recipient will be awarded \$250 in August and \$250 in January 2013, as long as he or she maintains at least a 2.0 GPA and remains in good standing at the school attended. This money can be used to help buy some texts or pay some tuition or room and board.

This is the sixth year the CCHS is offering this scholarship.
