## Grandson to compete nationally

Christopher Kincheloe, a junior at Maine West High School in Des Plaines, Ill., was one of 11 students from Maine West High School who competed at the Illinois State DECA competition in early March, and placed in the top three in the state, qualifying the students for the National DECA competition to be held in Salt Lake City, Utah, the end of April.

Christopher placed second in the state competition. The eleven Maine West national qualifying students wrote lengthy research papers and created and rehearsed a 10 to 15 minute presentation that they presented to real world professionals at the state competition.

Christopher was part of a three-person team whose research and presentation focused on the benefits of on-line banking to both a local bank and its customers.

At the national competition, the Maine West students will be presenting their research papers again, but will be competing against the top performers from other states. Thousands of students from around the U.S., Canada and Europe will be attending the national DECA competition.

DECA is an organization that prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs for careers in marketing, finance, hospitality and management in high schools and colleges around the globe.

Elias Matthew Walters was born on Dec. 30, 2011, in Annapolis, Md. He weighed in at 6 pounds and was 18 1/2-inches long.

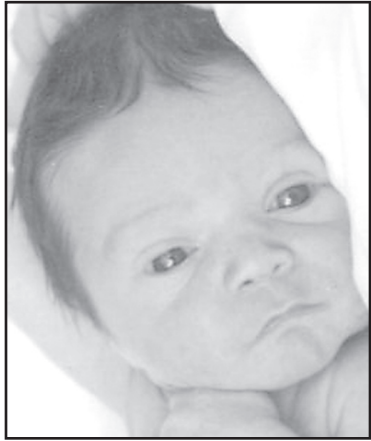
The son of Lt. Tobias and Sara Walters, California, Md, Elias was welcomed home by his big brother, James Douglas.

Schoenrogge plans to major in computer software support at CCC. She is the daughter of Craig and Juciara Schoenrogge of St. Francis.

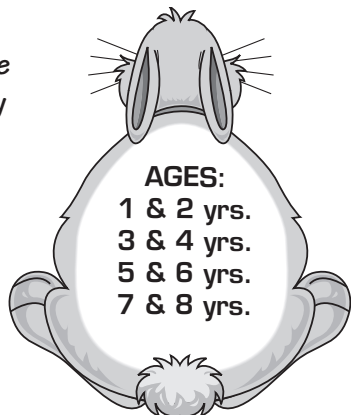
