Area teams compete at invitational track meet

The St. Francis Invitational Track and Field Meet was held 6" on Tuesday, April 24th. Thirteen teams competed for the team 8 3/4" championship with Decatur Community winning both the boys and girls divisions. St. Francis placed 2nd in the boys division and 11th in the girls division.

Decatur Community scored 76 points to earn first place in the boys division. St. Francis was second with 65 points. Oakley placed third with 56.5, narrowly edging Wallace County who scored 55.
