**Water Needs for Cattle** 

With summer just around the also increase. corner, or in some cases already here - it's good to remind ourselves of beef cattle water requirements and how important it becomes during those hot days.

Water requirements for beef cattle depend on weight, stage of production (such as lactation), and temperature. As weight increases, the amount of water needed also increases. The same range from 1 gallon per 100 holds true for temperature, as temperature increases, so does water intake. Also, if the animal is lactating, water requirements during the hottest weather.

Here are some considerations for water intake that may be helpful:

1. Daily water intake may vary from 3 to 30 gallons per day depending on age, body size (weight), stage of production and the environment (mainly air temperature).

2. Water consumption will pounds of body weight during cold weather to nearly 2 gallons per 100 pounds of body weight County Extension Agent

3. Lactating cows require nearly twice as much water as dry cows.




