# Two tracksters head to state

Indian track class 1A regional qualifiers headed to Hays on Friday, May 18, to compete for the chance to go to state. There was some close competition for the young athletes and senior Isaac Schiltz won first place in the pole vault with a personal record of 14' 7", over two feet higher than his closest competitor.
