

Kansans looking to save time and gas by eliminating a visit to a county treasurer's office can now take advantage of the state's online option for renewing vehicle tags without credit card or electronic check processing fees.

For the next 12 months, beginning Wednesday, convenience fees will be waived so more Kansans will renew online at KSWebTags.


"With so many people today using their computers, tablets and cell phones to do everything from shopping to sharing photos, we want to make sure they also know they can conveniently renew vehicle registrations from the comfort of home," Director of Vehicles Donna Shelite said.

Most people have three options for renewing their tags. They can visit their county treasurer, renew the mail.

The KSWebTags.org online renewal option is available to 1) anyone whose vehicle is registered in Kansas, 2) whose address on the renewal is current, and 3) who has vehicle insurance as required by law.

The online service requires a personal identification number, which is printed on the registration renewal notices Kansans receive in
