

The responsibilities of Local Work Groups are identified in the Conservation Program Delivery Manual. They include:

• Ensuring that a conservation needs assessment to identify priority resource concerns is developed using community stakeholder input and use the conservation needs assessment to help identify program funding needs and conservation practices.

> • The Local Work Groups' recommendations will be reviewed by the Kansas Technical Committee for submittal to United States Department of Agriculture agencies.

> • The work groups should be diverse and focus on agricultural interests and natural resource issues existing in the community. Membership should include agricultural producers representing the variety of crops, livestock and poultry raised within the local area; owners of nonindustrial private forest land, representatives of agricultural and environmental organizations; and governmental agencies carrying out agricultural and natural resource conservation and activities. The work groups also take into account concerns of particular historically underserved groups and individuals including but not limited to women, persons with disabilities, socially disadvantaged and limited resource groups.
